OVERVIEW: POLAND & CHINA

Since its launch five years ago, the "16+1" initiative has been the focal point of relations between China and Central and Eastern Europe. Its main idea is to boost connectivity, trade, infrastructure-building and people-to-people exchanges, thus opening new opportunities for Polish entrepreneurs. As a major regional country-member and the new seat of the Coordinating Secretariat for Maritime Issues, Poland is becoming China's key partner in the European Union.

ESTABLISHING A STRONG POLITICAL PLATFORM

In 2016 Poland and China established a comprehensive, strategic partnership and reached a number of agreements that laid the institutional groundwork for deeper economic cooperation. They cover a wide range of areas, such as building sustainable infrastructure and boosting tourism. The stable relationship has been marked by further mutual visits at the national and local level. In May 2017 the Polish Prime Minister participated in the One Belt, One Road Forum in Beijing, emphasizing Poland's engagement in the initiative. As a committed member of the "16+1" framework, Poland is the seat of three organizations coordinating regional cooperation: the China-CEEC Secretariat for Maritime Issues, China-CEEC Business Council and the Secretariat of the China-CEEC Investment Promotion Agencies.

Poland's strategic location makes the country a significant logistic hub for international trade. The Łódź-Chengdu cargo railway connection was inaugurated during the visit of President Xi Jinping to Poland in 2016. In 2017 an agreement between Poczta Polska and China Post Group was signed with the idea of boosting global e-commerce. These undertakings are facilitating Polish export to China which is regarded as a particularly promising market for Polish food products. In 2017, after

a ban on imports from countries affected by the avian flu was placed on exporters from the EU, Chinese veterinary authorities re-opened the Chinese market to poultry from Poland, the first EU country to be granted the permission. Besides food products, China is a major importer of Polish copper, electrical equipment and machinery.

CREATING A FRIENDLY INVESTMENT ENVIRONMENT

Poland has favourable foreign investment policies, as well as a skilled labour force. This makes the country an attractive investment destination for Chinese companies – in November 2017 investors from China made it into the top in terms of the value of projects conducted by the Polish Investment and Trade Agency (PAIH). In Poland, Chinese firms invest mainly through M&A transactions and pay particular attention to the energy and technology sector. Last year, China Construction Bank opened its Warsaw office, making it the third Chinese bank operating in Poland. Chinese startups are also interested in entering the Polish market. Ofo, a bike-sharing company, will likely bring its yellow two-wheelers to Polish cities in 2018.



MAIN IDEA OF THE PROJECT

Warsaw-Beijing Forum: Youth for Business is a project organized by the Students' Organization for Law and Economy of China, established at the University of Warsaw. The Forum consists of two academic exchanges between students from the China University of Political Science and Law and the University of Warsaw. The participants attend a series of meetings, lectures and workshops led by world-class experts. Without a doubt, the Project creates a great opportunity to gain essential knowledge, which will certainly build a new generation of leaders and professionals.

The Forum is an initiative that aims at promoting and developing entrepreneurship, mobility and international cooperation among young professionals from Poland and China. The main objective of the Project is to create a friendly and favourable space for developing knowledge about Chinese and Polish culture, business etiquette and habits. It aims to impact trade, mutual understanding and international business. Another crucial aspect of the Project is the exchange of opinions and experience in the academic field.







BUSINESS ASPECT

From the very beginning, the Forum received much attention and support from numerous global law firms, international corporations and think-tanks. Obtaining partners such as KGHM Polska Miedź, K&L Norton Rose Fulbright, SDZLegal Schindhelm, Deloitte, PwC, DLA Piper and many others is indeed a remarkable success. The support received from partners and sponsors not only makes Warsaw-Beijing Forum possible in its current form, but also builds a great milieu for developing economic and business skills. The know-how acquired during workshops, meetings and lectures with experienced businessmen and professionals is invaluable.

WARSAW-BEIJING FORUM 2017

The Fourth Edition of the Project

The tagline of the Fourth Edition of the Project was *Common Ambition*, a theme which highlighted the students' drive to improve the Sino-Polish economic, political and cultural relations, their willingness to broaden their understanding of the current affairs in the participant countries, as well as their desire to build a shared platform for discussion.

The Project showed that Poland has much to offer as a country of developed legal tradition, utilizing standards of enforceability of contracts, which makes it **a good place for business**. Furthermore, the visit can inspire the Chinese participants to apply some of the Polish legal solutions to their own legal system in the future. In turn, the events held during the Chinese part of the Project proved that **China is currently one of the leading countries in developing new ideas**, crucial in facing the challenges of the fast-evolving society and economy of the modern world. The Chinese students gained knowledge that could prove useful in **facilitating Chinese investments in Poland and the CEE region**, whether they decide to provide legal service to enterprises interested in investing or try their hand at creating their own business projects in our country.

The events promoted Poland as a place where innovative business can flourish. Moreover, the activities of the Fourth Edition were also focused on **overcoming cultural barriers** arising from vast differences between the students' cultural backgrounds. Many events, such as visits to famous museums, deepened the participants' understanding of the complicated history of both countries. The **mutual appreciation** of great cuisine and marvellous cultural sites of Poland and China is a factor that can stimulate a further exchange of ideas between the students and inspire them to **develop joint professional projects** in the future. This year's edition was enriched by **a visit to Chengdu**, where the students met with the **Consul General of the Republic of Poland - Ms Katarzyna Wilkowiecka**. And finally, as in the previous editions - they were hosted in the Shanghai branch of the main Partner of Warsaw-Beijing Forum - **KGHM Polska Miedź**.





THE WARSAW PART

The first part of the Project was held in Warsaw between 17th and 24th in May 2017. The students not only had the opportunity to meet the Prime Minister of Poland, but they were also acquainted with the theoretical and procedural aspects of the Polish and European law. What is more, the participants saw the heart of the Polish apple production in Grójec. The varied topics of the meetings allowed the Chinese students to gain an understanding of Polish culture, law and economy.

THE BEIJING PART

The second part of the Forum was held in Beijing between 8th and 15th November 2017. The participants gained knowledge of the framework and institutions of the Chinese legal system during lectures held at the Supreme Court of China and China International Economic and the Trade Arbitration Commission. Furthermore, thanks to the visits in various law firms located in Beijing, they had an opportunity to learn about the ins and outs of practising law in China. The meeting and constructive discussion in Mobike's headquarters provided an insight into building a successful startup in China.







The Ministry of Science and Higher Education Grant: The First Polish Academic Conference on Legal and Tax Issues of Trade between Poland and China

Warsaw-Beijing Forum has also been awarded a grant from **the Ministry of Science and Higher Education**. The award allowed Warsaw-Beijing Forum members to organize **the First Polish Academic Conference on Legal and Tax Issues of Trade between Poland and China**. The event gave the listeners a chance to take a deeper look into one of the most important aspects of the Sino-Polish relations - taxation issues and tax law. The participants had



an opportunity to listen to Mr Tomasz Janyst, PhD Candidate and lawyer at the Industrial and Commercial Bank of China (Europe) who held a lecture about financial aspects of commercial exchange with China. Later on, Mrs Edyta Demby-Siwek, Head of the Department of Trademarks in the Polish Patent Office, presented a comparison of Polish and Chinese trademark law. Finally, Dr Marcin Lachowicz, lawyer at the Ministry of Finance, acquainted the participants with the jurisdiction of tax law concerning Sino-Polish commercial relations. The students could also present their own papers. The conference proceedings have been published and are currently available to the public.



"Wspieramy Rozwój" programme

Warsaw-Beijing Forum has been awarded a grant in the "Wspieramy rozwój" programme organized by Cedrob S.A. Cedrob S.A. is the leader in the meat and processed poultry production and also the largest company with domestic capital in the sector. The aim of the programme is to support various activities which greatly benefit the community. Thanks to this distinction the students were able to foster the 4th Edition of Warsaw-Beijing Forum by creating a compendium for Polish enterprises who are considering exporting their products to China.

THE OPENING CONFERENCE OF THE WARSAW PART

Wednesday, May 17th 2017



The Opening Conference of the Fourth Edition of Warsaw-Beijing Forum took place in the Ballroom of the Tyszkiewicz-Potocki Palace, one of the most beautiful neoclassical buildings in the city. Apart from the participants of the Forum from Warsaw and Beijing, the conference was attended by the representatives of partner Universities, diplomatic corps, Partners, and Sponsors of the Project. The Conference consisted of official opening speeches given by Olga Smętek - the Main Coordinator of the Forum, Prof. Tomasz Giaro - Dean of the Faculty of Law and Administration of the University of Warsaw, Dr Piotr Grzebyk - Academic Guardian of the Forum and Dr Yuan Gong - Vice Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies of China University of Political Science and Law. During the event, a special discussion panel took place. The panel titled "Sino-Polish cooperation: key industries, promising sectors, common ambitions"

was enriched with the presence of special speakers: Mrs. Halina Bajczuk - Vice Director of Foreign Markets and Intermodal Commercial Office at PKP Cargo, Mr. Edward Zhu - Vice President of Polish-Chinese Business Council, Mr. Marek Wejtko, Head of Asia - Pacific Unit of the Ministry of the Economic Development, and Mr. Bartosz Michalak - CEO of the Polish-Chinese Cooperation Forum. The dynamic debate was moderated by the Co-founder of the Project, Maximilian Piekut. The Opening Conference ended with a formal reception, providing networking opportunities for all the guests of the Conference.





Thurdsay, May 18th 2017



LECTURE BY THE POLISH INNOVATIVE MEDICAL CLUSTER PIKMED'S EXPERT

Mr. Tomasz Szelągowski - President of the Board of Polish Innovative Medical Cluster delivered a lecture focused on how the healthcare is changing and developing, along with the technology used to raise its standards. The lecturer's main aim was to raise the participants' awareness on the subject of urgent changes in the healthcare system, e.g. the need for creating a new law that will enable to conduct medical examinations and file prescriptions via the Internet. Mr Szelągowski also referred to the differences between Chinese and Western medicine, presenting both the advantages and disadvantages of each.

CASE STUDY BY SDZLEGAL SCHINDHELM'S EXPERT

The case study, prepared by Dr Agnieszka Łuszpak-Zając, was focused on doing business in Poland, mainly on trade agreements and the contractual clauses. A crucial part of the meeting was teamworking - the participants were divided into four groups with each working on a different issue. It allowed the members to understand and learn more about the provisions typical for international contracts, possible risk in the contracts, how to secure each part and how to define the key provisions. Dr Agnieszka Łuszpak-Zając also clarified how SDZLegal works with its Chinese partners and pointed out the threats and opportunities of the cooperation between Poland and China.





VISIT TO THE SUPREME COURT OF POLAND

The visit to the Supreme Court of Poland consisted of two parts. Firstly, Prof. Małgorzata Wąsek-Wiaderek introduced the juridical system in Poland and underlined the special role of the Supreme Court. Secondly, the participants were given a unique opportunity to tour the building, which was crowned with a stroll around the gardens of the Court's rooftop. The Beijing Team was eager to ask many questions concerning the role of EU law in the Polish judicial system, the competences of judges, questions in abstracto and in concreto. Ultimately, Prof. Yuan Gang reflected on many similarities between the judicial systems of China and Poland.

LECTURE BY TRINITY LAB'S EXPERT

The lecture focused on a topic crucial for understanding Polish society in the past and in the present: the values of the nobility (called *szlachta* in Polish) and its relations with commoners. After a short introduction to the issue and an explanation of the terminology, Mr. Piotr Frankowski, an expert from the Trinity Culture Lab, described the historical changes which had a major influence on shaping the Kingdom of Poland into a modern country, and the chronology of its fights for independence. Later on, the students had the possibility to broaden their knowledge of the legal aspects of successive republics established by the Poles after uprisings.

Friday, May 19th 2017



LECTURE BY DR PAWEŁ WOJCIECHOWSKI AND PROF. MAŁGORZATA KORZYCKA

The lecture about the food law was split into two parts. During the first part, Professor Małgorzata Korzycka stressed the relevance of the laws concerning food industry in the European Union and in Poland. Participants also learnt about the Polish legal language regarding the food law. The second part was held by Paweł Wojciechowski, who described administrative and criminal liability in the food law in Poland. Preventive and repressive functions of those two liabilities were characterized. Moreover, the participants were given various examples of punishments executed when one breaches the food law.

MEETING WITH MR JANUSZ PIECHOCIŃSKI - FORMER DEPUTY MINISTER AND CEO OF THE POLISH-ASIAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

The participants had the honour to meet the former Deputy Prime Minister, Janusz Piechociński. Mr. Piechociński shared many interesting facts about China and its relations with Poland. He highlighted the chances for Poland coming from such projects as the *One Belt One Road* or the AIIB. A significant part of his speech was focused on the current economic exchange between Poland and China and the ways of improving it. Mr. Piechociński also emphasized the importance of cultural and academic exchange as the foundation of mutual understanding and friendship. On a final note, he appealed to the participants to become ambassadors of the Polish-Chinese relationship.





VISIT TO THE APPLE ORCHARD AND FRUIT PROCESSING PLANT IN GRÓJEC

The participants of the Forum took a field trip to Europe's biggest orchard one of the most important fruit producing regions in Europe (and the biggest in terms of apples) - Grójec district. The Polish and Chinese students had a chance to find out how their food is being made (or, to be precise - grown) - from the apple trees, through processing all the way to the customer. At three different fruit producer groups, the students learned about the tradition of the region, quality assurance and the laws protecting the name of the *jabłko grójeckie* (the Grójec apple), as it received a Protected Geographical Indication (PGI) plaque. They were truly surprised to learn that the tradition of fruit producing dates back to the 16th century. Later on, the students were hosted by one of the orchard farmers, who answered all the questions about the ins and outs of the apple production.

Monday, May 20th 2017



LECTURE BY PROFESSOR GÓRALCZYK

The participants had an opportunity to attend a lecture held by Prof. Bogdan Góralczyk. The meeting was focused on the subject of China's influence, particularly, whether China is ready for the role of a global leader. The students were presented with the historical changes that had a major influence on shaping the Sino-Polish relations. Prof. Góralczyk discussed the economic impact of Poland's geographical location and its potential benefits for the development of the cooperation. He also expressed his hopes for the success of such initiatives as the *One Belt One Road* and the *16+1 Partnership*. The meeting ended with a discussion on the problems both countries are facing, such as language and cultural barriers.

LECTURE BY ECH&W LAW FIRM

The lecture on criminal liability in business was held by Mr Krzysztof Sobieski, an attorney at the Elżanowski Cherka Wąsowski Law Firm. Mr Krzysztof Sobieski explained the importance of fair dealing in business and showcased the risks of conducting business in Poland. He underlined that in Poland companies and people in charge of conducting business can be held liable for criminal offences. At the end of the lecture, the participants of Warsaw-Beijing Forum were given a brief description of the most prevalent crimes and criminal offences. The lecture ended with a lively Q&A session, during which the counter-actions against corporate criminal offences in Poland and in China were discussed.



SEMINAR AND COCKTAIL RECEPTION AT K&L GATES

At the meeting with the Chinese team of K&L Gates Law Firm, the participants of the Project were introduced to the basic rules and issues concerning foreign investment in Poland. The lawyers from K&L Gates shared their experience and knowledge with the participants of the Project, describing the most famous cases of Chinese investments in Poland. The importance was placed on the experience of Sinopec Group, the Chinese company that built a part of the Łódź-Warsaw highway and had particular issues with finishing the project, which were connected with the different investment environment in Poland and general cultural differences.

VISIT TO GOOGLE CAMPUS

The participants started the day off with a visit to the impressive Google Campus, where they were given a tour around the state-of-the-art campus and later had a chance to experience traditional Polish culture: the language, cuisine, holidays and much more. One could feel that Google Campus is a welcoming place for everyone who has lots of ideas but does not know where to start.



Tuesday, May 21st 2017



WORKSHOP WITH WARSAW BAR ASSOCIATION AND MEETING WITH DR SŁAWOMIR ŻÓŁTEK

On Tuesday, the participants took part in a workshop conducted by the Warsaw Bar Association, during which the students were negotiating terms and conditions of trade contracts. Before the participants started the negotiation game, Mr Mariusz Maciejewski held a short lecture about the principles of good negotiations. The group work enabled the participants to learn and better understand customs in Poland and China. After the game, the Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Law and Administration - Dr Sławomir Żółtek - paid a visit to the Chinese delegation to officially welcome them on behalf of the Faculty.

CASE STUDY BY CUSHMAN&WAKEFIELD

The meeting on investments in properties in the CEE region was held by Mr Paweł Rudiak. After a short introduction to the company's profile, Mr. Rudiak gave an economic overview of Poland and China, identifying the main differences between the economies of both countries. He compared the largest investment transactions in the CEE region with investments in real property in China. Core investments dominate the Chinese market. At the end of his speech, Mr Rudiak familiarized the participants with the factors behind property pricing: macroeconomic policy, interest rates, planning policy, building condition, risk assessment, rental growth, tenant concentration. The meeting ended with a fruitful Q&A session.







SIGHTSEEING WALKING TOUR AND A CRUISE ON THE VISTULA RIVER PROVIDED BY THE WARSAW TOURIST OFFICE

The Chinese students had an opportunity to explore the highlights of Warsaw during a walking tour organised by the Warsaw Tourist Office. The tour was held by a Chinese-speaking guide. He shared his impressive knowledge and revealed a few secrets and curiosities about Warsaw. While visiting the spots that make up the soul of the city - the Old Town, the Royal Castle, the Holy Cross Church and the POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews - the participants received both an overview of the city and a good introduction to the Polish history and culture.

Later on, the participants also took a cruise down "the queen of Polish rivers" – the Vistula river. The students marvelled at the picturesque landscape of Warsaw, ablaze in the beautiful rays of sunset. It was also another opportunity to show the favourite city spots of the Project members and talk about the vibrant life of Vistula's banks with the Chinese delegation. Thanks to the modern, well–equipped boats that took the team from Czerniakowski Harbor all the way down to the Old Town area, the students saw the city from a unique viewpoint. These one-of-a-kind city views will definitely last in the participants' memory for a long time.

Wednesday, May 24th 2017



MEETING WITH THE PRIME MINISTER MATEUSZ MORAWIECKI

The last day of the Warsaw part of the Forum started with the week's highlight: a meeting with the Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki. The Prime Minister told the participants about the Polish Government's plans for developing Sino-Polish cooperation. He also highlighted the obstacles concerning this area of international relations. Mr. Morawiecki encouraged the guests to discuss prospects of Sino-Polish economic partnership and answered all questions asked by the students. The participants also had an occasion to propose ideas and exchange some thoughts during a short personal talk with the Prime Minister. After the meeting with Mr. Morawiecki, the students had a chance to take part in discussion with the experts of Ministry of Development. Mr. Marek Wejtko, Mr. Łukasz Porażyński, and Mr. Tadeusz Kościński outlined briefly the work in the Ministry and described the strategy for constructing relations with China.







THE OPENING CONFERENCE OF THE BEIJING PART

Wednesday, November 8th 2017



The official opening of the Fourth Edition of Warsaw-Beijing Forum took place in the conference hall of the **BUPT Hote**l. The guests of the Opening Conference were not only the participants of the Forum from Warsaw and Beijing, but also representatives of cooperating Universities, Partners, and Sponsors of the Project. The ceremony began with official opening speeches by Gao Huanyue - Deputy Party Secretary of China University of Political Science and Law, Prof. Tomasz Giaro - Dean of the Faculty of Law and Administration, Dr Piotr Grzebyk -Academic Guardian of the Forum, Xue Xiaojian - Vice Dean of Law School of China University of Political Science and Law, Olga Smetek - the Main Coordinator of the Forum, Maximilian Piekut - the Co-founder of the Project, Wen Xuechun - the Main Coordinator of the Chinese part of the Forum, Zhan Ling - Secretary of Business Development

Division of the China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission, **Wan Yingjun** - Senior Partner of Long'an Law Firm, **Gu Jia** - Representative of Huayu Yuandian. The event was a great opportunity to listen to inspirational speeches and to have the first encounter with the Chinese culture. Thurdsay, November 9th 2017




HERBERT SMITH FREEHILLS

Later in the day, the Warsaw-Beijing Forum members had the pleasure to visit the Beijing office of Herbert Smith Freehills. The participants learned about the specifics and methods of working at an international law firm. Afterwards, the students were given a lecture on international commercial arbitration, as the company is considered to have the worldwide reputation of an arbitration powerhouse. They became familiar with Asian arbitration rules from a practical point of view. The last part of the meeting was a workshop on negotiations, during which the delegation of Polish students could negotiate a deal with their Chinese friends.

KING&WOOD MALLESONS

The first lecture of the Forum was held at the headquarters of King&Wood Mallesons, one of the top 10 Global Law Firms and the winner of numerous awards since its founding in 1993. The participants were given hands-on advice on studying law and a profound insight into a lawyer's everyday job by Mr Xy Li, Partner at the firm. Afterwards, the hosts proceeded to the lecture on "Panda Bonds" – bonds issued by non-Chinese entities, denominated in RMB and sold in the People's Republic of China. The students also discussed related issues and challenges and found out that Poland was the first European sovereign government to issue such bonds.





WORKSHOPS ON THE CHINESE TRADITIONAL ART OF FABRIC DYEING

The participants also had a chance to take part in workshops on the traditional Chinese style of dyeing fabrics. Not only was it an occasion for the students to listen and learn about the history and techniques of dyeing, but they were also able to create some extraordinary pieces of art by their own hands. All in all, one can consider it the most creative activity the participants attended in the Fourth Edition of Warsaw-Beijing Forum.

Friday, November 10th 2017



VISIT TO CHINA INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC AND TRADE ARBITRATION COMMISSION

On the third day, the participants of the Fourth Edition of Warsaw-Beijing Forum were invited to the China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission (CIETAC), one of the major permanent arbitration institutions in the world set up in 1956. The students had an opportunity to learn about alternative dispute resolutions in China and get an insight into the importance of arbitration in international trade. CIETAC's representatives presented the structure, procedures and statistics of the court. After the presentation, students discussed the differences between the Polish and Chinese system and visited the office area of CIETAC.

VISIT TO SUPREME PEOPLE'S COURT

The participants started their visit to the Supreme People's Court with a tour of the Court's Museum. First, they learned about the formation of law in China and how it has been influenced by other legal traditions. Later, Ms. Li Xiao introduced them to the basic concepts of the legal system in China and the role of the Supreme People's Court. The lecture also deepened the participants' understanding of the reforms that China's judicial system is currently undergoing.





MOBIKE'S HEADQUARTES

The third day of the Forum ended with the visit to Mobike, which is the world's largest bike sharing operator by the number of bikes available for hire. Despite only being founded just two years ago, the company is already operating in over 160 cities, including markets outside of China – e.g. in Rotterdam, Milan and Singapore. The hosts unveiled the technical solutions used in all generations of the company's bikes. The students learned about the idea behind Mobike – to enable affordable and easy short urban trips while reducing congestion and carbon footprint.

Monday, November 11th 2017



BEIJING CULTURAL AND CREATIVE INDUSTRY EXHIBITION CENTRE

In this year's Edition, the participants of Warsaw-Beijing Forum had a chance to visit an immense site for the development of creative industry in China. The Beijing Cultural and Creative Industry Exhibition Centre displays the best of Chinese creative energy. It is a spot where technology meets culture, and culture meets novel ideas. It is also a place for companies to uncover talents or sign contracts with students who have taken a fancy to innovation. The Exhibition Centre has become an important platform for sharing resources of cultural and creative industries and releasing the vitality of industrial innovation. It is a chance for the city to open a new chapter and build itself into the country's cultural landscape.
